Brightspace 1: The Basics

Aim of this resource:

Brightspace is the virtual learning environment (VLE) in use at TU Dublin City Campus. This resource provides an overview of what Brightspace can be used for; how to login; how to navigate Brightspace, how to get access to the modules you need. After working your way through this resource you will have an understanding of what you need to do to use Brightspace to support your teaching.

How to change your password	Your Brightspace password is the same as your standard TU Dublin password. You can change/reset this password by contacting IT Support at <u>itsupport.city@tudublin.ie</u> or by using <u>https://tudublin.ie/password/</u>
Understand the connection between Brightspace and Banner	Brightspace modules are created automatically based on the Banner record. The modules you are linked to automatically in Brightspace at the start of the new academic year are those which you were connected to in Banner in approximately mid-July (date varies from year to year) and which had student enrolments in Banner in the previous academic year.
	If a module is newly-validated in Banner during the course of the academic year then that module automatically becomes available in Brightspace

	approximately 48 hours after it is created in Banner. However, lecturers must request access via the <u>online form</u> (automatic enrolment of lecturers only happens once per year, at the start of the academic year).
Understand the Brightspace module lifecycle	Each Summer, in preparation for the new academic year, new shell modules are created in Brightspace based on the Banner record. Lecturers then populate those new Brightspace shells by either importing the content from the previous year's module (a two minute process) or by building the new module from scratch.
	Brightspace modules are unique - you cannot reuse the same module from semester to semester, or from year to year. Students keep their access to the modules they have taken from year to year over the course of their programme, <i>therefore no modules where teaching has concluded should ever be cleared out, reset and/or reused with a different cohort.</i> Do not un-enrol students and do not delete assessment submissions.
