About the Pathways Together Programme:

What is it?

• The Pathways Together Programme is a post-secondary higher-level education programme for people with intellectual disabilities.

Duration and Qualifications:

- It is a full-time, 1.5 year course.
- It is aligned to level 4 on the National Framework of Qualifications (NFQ).
- Successful completion leads to a Certificate in Independent Living Skills.

Location:

- Part of the School of Social Sciences, Education and Law in the Faculty of Humanities.
- Offered on Blanchardstown and Tallaght campuses. 8 places per campus.





Features and Supports:

- Inclusive programme with modules in a range of disciplines.
- Social care supports and opportunities for work placements.
- Post-graduate support for 12-months.

Funding:

• Funded by the Higher Education Authority (HEA) under PATH 4.

Year 2:

- •Modern foreign language (Spanish (TA) / French (BN).
- •Health and fitness 3 (BN only).
- •Exercise for Health (TA only).
- •Exploration of Science (TA only).
- •Community horticulture (BN only)
- •Outdoor learning.
- •Visual arts 2.

Academic Calendar:

- Semester 1 starts in January 2025 and ends in June 2025.
- Semester 2 begins in September 2025 and ends in Dec 2025.
- Semester 3 begins in January 2026 and ends in April / May 2026.
- There will be a Winter break and a Spring break.
- There will be assessments in each semester.

- Have an intellectual disability.
- Be willing to come for interview.
