Ongoing	TU Dublin appointed a <a href="#">Directorate of Equality, Diversity and Inclusion</a> as part of our <a href="#">Strategic Intent 2030</a> under the People pillar in which we have committed to 'Being recognised as an exemplar in equality, diversity and inclusion (EDI)'.
Ongoing	<a href="#">The Fund for Students with Disabilities (FSD)</a> allocates funding to third-level colleges, including TU Dublin, for the provision of services and support to full-time and part-time students with disabilities.
Ongoing	The <a href="#">1916 Bursary Fund</a> was first established in 2017 to encourage participation and success by students who are most socio-economically disadvantaged and who are from groups most under-represented in higher education.
Ongoing	<a href="#">TU Dublin Student Dignity and Respect Policy and Procedures</a> highlights our commitment to providing a safe and positive environment in which to work and learn preventing discrimination and harassment.
Ongoing	TU Dublin <a href="#">Institute For Minority Entrepreneurship</a> was established to offer different minority groups in Ireland equal opportunity through entrepreneurship education and training.
Ongoing	TU Dublin offers <a href="#">TU Dublin Counselling Services</a> and <a href="#">Continuing With Your Studies Support Services</a> to assist students on their education journey.
Ongoing	<a href="#">TU Dublin Access Foundation Programme</a> is a one-year full-time course preparing students, both personally and academically, to pursue undergraduate programmes at TU Dublin. The course is of particular benefit to adults who have been out of education for a long time, or who did not complete a Leaving Certificate. In addition, applications from people whose skills no longer allow them to access the labour market can participate.
Ongoing	The <a href="#">DARE</a> (Disability Access Route to Education) is available at TU Dublin offering a third-level alternative admissions scheme for school-leavers whose disabilities have had a negative impact on

	their second-level education. It offers reduced points places to such school-leavers.
Ongoing	The Higher Education Access Route ( <a href="#">THE HEAR Scheme</a> ) is available at TU Dublin, encouraging school-leavers from socio-economically disadvantaged backgrounds to apply for full-time undergraduate programmes.
Ongoing	<a href="#">The Exceptional Circumstances Fund</a> supports TU Dublin students who cannot access traditional funding, by providing assistance directly to those experiencing extreme and immediate financial difficulty.
