	particular benefit to adults who have been out of education for a
	long time, or who did not complete a Leaving Certificate. In addition,
	applications from people whose skills no longer allow them to
	access the labour market can participate.
Ongoing	The <u>DARE</u> (Disability Access Route to Education) is available at TU
	Dublin offering a third-level alternative admissions scheme for
	school-leavers whose disabilities have had a negative impact on

	their second-level education. It offers reduced points places to such school-leavers.
Ongoing	The Higher Education Access Route (<u>THE HEAR Scheme</u>) is available at TU Dublin, encouraging school-leavers from socio-economically disadvantaged backgrounds to apply for full-time undergraduate programmes.
Ongoing	The Exceptional Circumstances Fund supports TU Dublin students who cannot access traditional funding, by providing assistance directly to those experiencing extreme and immediate financial difficulty.
